RESOLUTION ON - \$500,000 OF TRIBAL FUNDS BE MADE AVAILABLE FOR LOANS OR PURCHASE OF LAND; GENERAL SUPERINTENDENT AUTHORIZED TO CONSUMMATE PURCHASE OF 960 ACRES FROM WALTER SARRACINO; \$2,500 BE AUTHORIZED FOR EMERGENCY PURPOSES; TRIBAL OFFICE OF NAVAJO TRIBE BE LOCATED AT WINDOW ROCK; SALARY OF CHAIRMAN BE INCREASED TO \$5,000 AND VICE-CHAIRMAN TO \$2,400; SECRETARY OF INTERIOR REQUESTED TO APPROVE \$1,306,978 FOR ADMINISTRATION OF TRIBAL AFFAIRS FOR FISCAL YEAR 1951; POSITION OF SECRETARY-TREASURER BE ESTABLISHED; CHAIRMAN AND VICE-CHAIRMAN AUTHORIZED TO PREPARE PLANS OF OPERATIONS AND APPROVE MODIFICATIONS OF EXISTING ENTERPRISES; PLAN OF OPERATION OF TRIBE'S REVOLVING CREDIT PROGRAM MODIFIED, SUBJECT TO APPROVAL OF COMMISSIONER AND CREDIT COMMITTEE AUTHORIZE TWO OFFICERS TO APPROVE LOAN APPLICATIONS OF EMERGENCY NATURE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$350.00.

RESOLUTION ON - PER DIEM AND WAGES BE COMBINED AND PAID AS WAGES NOT TO EXCEED \$14.00 PER DAY FOR DELEGATES OF THE TRIBAL COUNCIL. ii
